This course will introduce methods for assigning value to aspects of the environment and to interhuman and human-environment interactions. The course draws on methods from philosophy, ecology, psychology, aesthetics, economics, religion, and more.

We will explore traditional and contemporary approaches to environmental valuation through five modules: 1) early U.S. environmental valuation; 2) Leopold's A/B dichotomy; 3) environmental movements; 4) ecosystem services; and 5) current environmental controversies. Each module will include negotiation games and scored experiential learning exercises to achieve specific course objectives.
